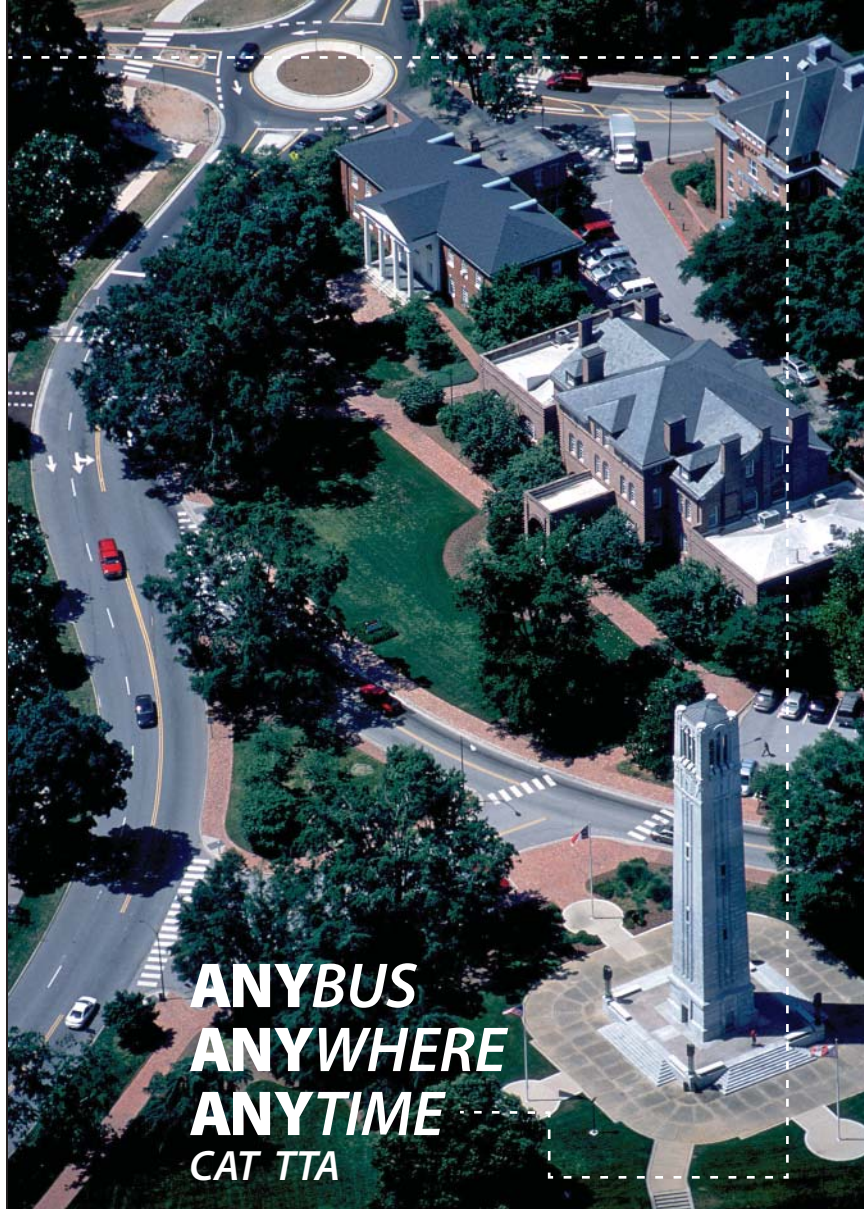

WHAT IS U-PASS?

Capital Area Transit (CAT) and Triangle Transit Authority (TTA) have partnered with NCSU Transportation to bring U-Pass to NC State University. U-Pass allows faculty, staff and students the freedom to get to and from campus, along with many of their favorite destinations in the Triangle, **without having to pay a fare**. With U-Pass you can ride any route, any time, just by showing your NCSU ID.

Who can use U-Pass?

Any faculty, staff, student or employee with a valid University ID can use U-Pass.

How do you ride?

All you have to do is show your University ID to the bus driver.

Where can I go with U-Pass?

This brochure will introduce you to the CAT and TTA transit systems. CAT serves the greater Raleigh area. TTA serves the Raleigh/Durham/Chapel Hill area.

Where can I get CAT bus schedules?

All of CAT's route and schedule information is available online at www.raleigh-nc.org/transit. Schedule brochures are also available in the NCSU transportation office, or you can pick them up at any of the Raleigh branches of the Wake County Public Library or downtown at the Moore Square Transit Station Information Booth.

How do I plan my trip on CAT?

To find out the quickest and easiest way to reach your destination call CAT's telephone information line at 828-7228. Information clerks are ready to help you plan your trip. When calling, be prepared to tell the clerk where you are, where you would like to go, and when you need to get there.

Where do I catch the CAT bus?

Catch a CAT at any CAT bus stop sign located throughout Raleigh. These signs are conveniently located along each route. However, buses will stop for passengers anywhere along the route where it is safe for the driver to stop.

What CAT routes serve the NCSU campus?

Route 4 (Rex Hospital), route 11 (Avent Ferry), route 11c (Buck Jones Connector), route 12 (Method). Hop on these buses and transfer to any other CAT bus to continue your trip. Every regular route travels through the downtown Moore Square Transit Station.

Where can I get TTA bus schedules?

All of TTA's route & schedule information is available online at www.ridetta.org. TTA bus schedules are also available at the NCSU transportation office, at Moore Square Transit Station Information Booth in downtown Raleigh, and at many other public places. In addition, you may request bus schedules by mail by calling 549-9999, ext. 3.

How do I plan my trip on TTA?

Determine the quickest and easiest way to reach your destination by reviewing the TTA bus schedules, or by calling the TTA Customer Service Representative at 549-9999, ext. 1. When calling, be prepared to tell the clerk where you are, where you would like to go, and when you need to get there.

Where do I catch the TTA bus?

You may catch a TTA bus at any bus stop along the TTA route located throughout the TTA system network. These signs are conveniently located along each route.

What TTA routes serve the NCSU campus?

Routes 105 & 107 along Hillsborough Street, between downtown Raleigh, and Research Triangle Park. Route 105 also provides an easy transfer to the Airport. Routes 301 & 305 along Western Boulevard, between downtown Raleigh and the town of Cary.

WOLFLINE

How can I get more information about NCSU's Wolfline?

You can ride the Wolfline fare free anytime, no ID required. Just board the bus and find a seat. Wolfline brochures are available throughout campus. Routes and schedules are also online at www.ncsu.edu/wolfline. You can also call the NCSU Transportation office at 515-3424 or the Wolfline information line at 515-WOLF (9653).
